Individual Pupil Rewards

Pupils can earn daily points for each of their sessions. There are 10 sessions throughout the day on pupil timetables. These include four lessons, a reading session/ guided reading session, an independent session/ settling session, break, lunch, tutor time and enrichment time. The staff supporting the pupil will discuss the points the pupil has achieved regularly throughout the day. A pupil can achieve either 0, 5 or 10 points for each session. The points rewarded are given at the discretion of the staff working with the pupil in that session. High expectations and boundaries will be upheld and points awarded fairly.

The HLTA supporting the pupil in the class will record the points throughout the day and collate them at the end of each day and each week. Points equate to money. 10p per session -£1 per day. Pupils collect their points throughout the half term and can spend this at the end of each half term on a trip, voucher or item from the shop or internet. Staff will get parental permission before buying or ordering anything to ensure they give permission for the item or voucher. Spending points money can be also flexible where appropriate. For example, if a pupil needs to spend their money after a week or two to remain motivated, this can take place.

Points also count towards the 'Friday Afternoon Rewards Trip'. There are three options depending on the number of points achieved by the pupil over the week.

Gold – Over 450 points

Pupil can earned a reward to chose to go off site or stay in school. Offsite activities could be Trampoline, Escape rooms, Clip and Climb, Café or Park visits.

Silver- Over 200, Under 450

Pupils have earned reward time to stay at school. These activities could include Art, cooking, films or games.

Bronze- Under 200 points

The pupil will carry out a restorative conversation or activity depending on what suits the pupil best. This time also allows for relationships to be repaired and reattuned. Once this has taken place the pupil can access the Silver reward on site if they wish.

Class Rewards

As well as individual rewards, there will also be a class reward system to encourage working together and group cohesion. These will fall under the following categories.

- Ready
- Respectable
- Safe

Each class will have their own reward system which will be agreed by the staff and pupils in that class at the beginning of the year. Examples of this are class pom pom jars. Teachers will

award pom poms for pupils being ready, respectable and safe. When the jar is full, the class can choose a reward that they all access together such as ice creams, a trip to the cinema, lunch at a café, ordering lunch to school for their lunch, a trip to a climbing wall, trampoline park.
